

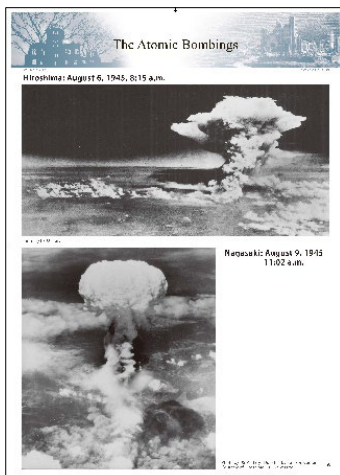
Loan/Donation of the Materials for the A-bomb Exhibit and Peace Education

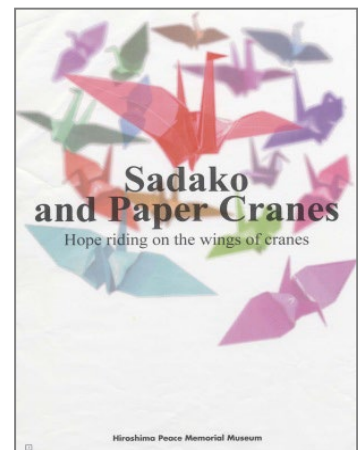

★ Hiroshima: A Mother's Prayer *available for donation	Based on footage of Hiroshima immediately after the atomic bombing, this documentary film calls for the abolition of nuclear weapons and the preciousness of peace as seen through the eyes of mothers. (1990 / 30 min. / color and some black and white)	Japanese, English, Korean, Chinese, Russian, French, Italian, German, Spanish, Thai, Indonesian, Malay, Portuguese, Arabic
★ Hiroshima Witness *available for donation	Film with testimonies of fourteen Hiroshima atomic bomb survivors. (1986~ / approx. 140 min. / color)	English
The Effects of the Atomic Bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki *for loan only	Documentary film shot in Hiroshima and Nagasaki immediately after the atomic bombings. Production began in September 1945, and was completed in April 1946. It was immediately taken to the U.S. and became known in Japan as "the phantom A-bomb film." It was returned and first shown to the public in 1967. (1946 / Hiroshima 81 min. Nagasaki 83 min. / black and white)	English (with Japanese subtitles)
The Children of Nagasaki *for loan only	Documentary film made from actual footage of Nagasaki immediately after the atomic bombing and testimony from atomic bomb survivors. (2005 / 30 min. / color and some black and white)	(*language option) Japanese / English
On a Paper Crane *for loan only	Kid-friendly animation that explains the importance of peace and the abolition of nuclear weapons. Based on the true story of Sadako Sasaki, who was exposed to the atomic bombing as a child and died of leukemia at the age of 12. (1993 / 27 min. / color)	(*language option) Japanese / English / French
Pica Don *for loan only	Animation that appeals for world peace by describing the catastrophic and tragic consequences of the atomic bomb explosion in Hiroshima on August 6, 1945. (1978 / 10 min. / color)	Silent film

Four items (marked with stars★) can be donated if continued use is desired;

"Hiroshima-Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Poster Set," the "Hiroshima" booklet, "Hiroshima: A Mother's Prayer," and "Hiroshima Witness."

All other items are for loan only and must be returned after use.

■ SHIPPING

- The Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum will pay for **outbound** shipping only.
- Please submit an application form well in advance of the proposed delivery date. We will send the DVDs by air. It usually takes about 2 weeks for delivery. For the "Hiroshima-Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Poster Set," we generally ship by Surface Air Lifted (SAL), which usually takes about 3 weeks.
